Chapter Committees

MathCOUNTS: The MathCOUNTS committee organizes volunteers, assists in proctoring the exams and serving lunch, as well as encourages the students every step of the way to help foster teamwork and competitive spirit. This national math competition inspires middle school students to achieve in math by providing a challenging and exciting forum. The regional competition occurs each year in February.

Wooden Bridge: This committee assists the Minnesota State University Moorhead Physics Department at the annual wooden bridge competition held during National Engineers Week (E-Week) in February. Duties of the committee members include advertising for the event, being a mentor for schools/students, scoring/weighting bridge components, and being a resource at round table discussions about engineering and F-M Engineers.

Golf Tournament: The golf tournament committee coordinates the yearly golf tournament that is hosted by our club in the summer.

Outreach/Public Relations: The outreach/public relations committee is chaired by the club President which coordinates events designed to increase STEM awareness and/or enhance our club's visibility in the public.

Donations: The donations committee reviews donation applications received from various student organizations/groups that request funds from our group. There will be two consideration periods each year. The applications should be submitted to the President Elect by October 15th and March 15th, with applications reviewed and notification provided by the end of those months.

Annual Banquet: The annual banquet committee is responsible for coordinating a venue, food service, and program for the annual banquet in February.

Scholarship: The scholarship committee is responsible for reviewing applications and selecting NDSU students to receive the club's annual scholarships. It is the committee's responsibility to determine the number of scholarships and amount awarded while keeping the amount within our annual budget.

Awards: The awards committee reviews project and individual submissions for receipt of the Project of the Year and Young Engineer of the Year awards presented at our annual banquet in February.
